MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR

Environment and Climate Change (ECC) update

Changes to CSA Standard B66

In 2021, CSA updated CSA Standard B66: Design, material, and manufacturing requirements for prefabricated septic tanks and sewage holding tanks. One of the changes includes a secondary safety device on access openings.

When risers above the tank access opening are provided, the manufacturer shall construct the tank in such a way that all joints between the tank access opening and the risers, as well as between all riser sections, are watertight. All access openings (which are meant to be removed) over chambers with an opening greater than 200 mm in diameter, where there is a risk of accidental entry, shall have a secondary safety device that can withstand 91 kg of dead load.

The On-site Sewage Disposal Systems Regulations require tanks to be watertight and to be selected or designed in accordance with the On-site Sewage Disposal Systems Standard. Section 6 of the Standard states that a septic tank, holding tank, and effluent chamber must have been certified as meeting, or as being equivalent to, CSA Standard B66.

Based on these requirements, starting in 2023 all tanks and chambers installed in Nova Scotia for an on-site sewage disposal system will be required to have a secondary safety device in risers as per the updated CSA B66 Standard. This applies to new notifications and approvals received after January 1, 2023 and is not retroactive to already installed tanks.

Working in Public Works Right of Way

Sometimes in a malfunction replacement a portion of the new system may need to be constructed in the right of way belonging to the Department of Public Works. ECC and Public Works have a memorandum of understanding that defines their own roles when this is necessary.

This MOU does not remove the requirement to obtain a "Work Within Highway Right of Way Permit" when working within a Public Works right of way.

A permit is required prior to constructing any portion of the system.




System Applications
